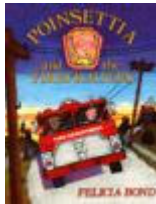




## Very Brave Fireman Stories for younger readers

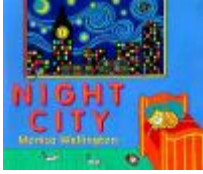
