Clarke, Pauline. **The Return of the Twelves.** Ju F Cla. Max finds twelve old wooden soldiers in the attic of his home and discovers they are alive. Historians have long been looking for them and, if found, they might be sold to an American museum where Max would never see them again.

Coville, Bruce. **Aliens Ate My Homework.** Ju F Cov SF. Rod is surprised when a miniature spaceship lands in his school science project and reveals five tiny aliens, who ask his help in apprehending an interstellar criminal.

DiTerlizzi, Tony and Holly Black. **The Field Guide** (Book 1 of the **Spiderwick Chronicles**). Ju F Dit. When the Grace children go to stay at their Great Aunt Lucinda's worn Victorian house, they discover a field guide to fairies and other creatures and begin to have some unusual experiences.

Enright, Elizabeth. **Zeee.** Ju F Enr. A tiny fairy, who hates people because they are always destroying her houses and cannot see her, finds a special Person and a splendid house.

Godden, Rumer. **Impunity Jane; the story of a pocket doll.** Ju F God A tiny doll lives an adventurous life in a little boy's pocket and as a member of a gang of boys.

Hodges, Margaret. **Gulliver in Lilliput.** Ju F Hod. On a voyage in the South Seas, an Englishman finds himself shipwrecked in Lilliput, a land of people only six inches high.

Jones, Elizabeth Orton. **Twig.** Ju F Jon. After magic makes a girl very tiny, she almost goes to fairyland with an elf and a fairy queen whom she meets, but at the last minute she decides to return to her own world which she discovers is not so ordinary after all.

King-Smith, Dick; illustrated by Jan Naimo Jones. **Lady Daisy.** Ju F Kin. Nine-year-old Ned faces a lot of teasing when he decides to keep a Victorian doll that speaks only to him.

Langerlöf, Selma. **The Wonderful Adventures of Nils.** Ju F Lag. A selfish little boy learns humility when he is made tiny by an elf and flies on a long trip with migratory geese

Lisle, Janet Taylor. **Afternoon of the Elves.** Ju F Lis. This enchanting story about friendship reveals the beauty, wonder and mystery that lies within the imagination. Sara-Kate, the poorest, least reputable girl in school, invites Hillary home to see what the village elves have built in her yard.

Norton, Mary. **The Borrowers.** Ju F Nor. Miniature people who live in an old country house are forced to emigrate from their home under the clock.

O'Brien, Robert C. **Mrs. Frisby and the Rats of Nimh.** Ju F Obr. Having no one to help her with her problems, a widowed mouse visits the rats whose former imprisonment in a laboratory made them wise and long lived.

Patron, Susan. **Five Bad Boys, Billy Que, and the Dustdobbin.** Ju E Pat. The Dustdobbin under his bed shrinks Billy Que down to its own size to teach him what it is like to be small, and he must get freely offered gifts from five stubborn boys before regaining his normal size.

Pelgrom, Els. **Little Sophie and Lanky Flop.** Ju F Els. The night that all her toys come to life, a sick little girl embarks on a strange journey with a dishonest rag doll, a wealthy teddy bear, and a talking cat, and her life is changed forever.

Rodda, Emily. **The Charm Bracelet** (Book 1 of the **Fairy Realm** Series.) Ju F Rod. When Jessie searches for her ill grandmother's missing charm bracelet, she is led to a magical world and finds she has a reason and right to be there.

Sharp, Margery. **The Rescuers.** Ju F Sha. Three enterprising mice undertake a mission for the Prisoners' Aid Society: the rescuing of a poet from the most terrible prison they have ever seen.

Tapp, Kathy Kennedy. **Moth-kin magic.** Ju F Tap. Several members of a Mothkin family, tiny people less than an inch tall, must escape or die when they are inadvertently captured by giants and imprisoned in glass bottles used to study plant life.

Warner, Sally. **Twilight Child.** Ju F War. Taken from eighteenth-century Finland by her father, teenager Eleni eventually finds a home in Scotland, receiving help along the way from brownies, fairies, and other creatures she has the ability to see and talk with.

White, E. B. **Stuart Little.** Ju F Whi. The debonair mouse Stuart Little sets out in the world to seek his dearest friend, a little bird who stayed for a few days in his family's garden.

Winthrop, Elizabeth. **The Castle in the Attic.** Ju F Win. A gift of a toy castle, complete with silver knight, introduces William to an adventure involving magic and a personal quest.

White, E. B. **Stuart Little.** Ju F Whi. The debonair mouse Stuart Little sets out in the world to seek his dearest friend, a little bird who stayed for a few days in his family's garden.

Zhitkov, Boris. **How I hunted the little fellows.** Ju F Zhi. Fascinated by the life-like miniature of a steamer on his grandmother's shelf, a young boy becomes convinced that there are little people inside and, ignoring the admonition not to touch, decides to find out for himself.

Andersen, Hans Christian; unabridged translation by Erik Haugaard ; illustrated by Arlene Graston. **Thumbelina.** Ju 398.2 And. After being kidnapped by an ugly toad, a beautiful girl no bigger than a thumb has a series of dreadful experiences before meeting a fairy prince just her size.

Barker, Cicely Mary. **The Complete Book of the Flower Fairies.** Ju 821 Bar. Contains a large collection of the author's fairy works, including a full-length children's story "The fairy necklaces", along with her illustrations celebrating fairies and flowers. Belting, Natalia. **Elves and Elfolk: Tales of the Little People.** Ju 398.45.

Kane, Barry and Tracy. **Fairy Houses --Everywhere!** Ju 398.45 Kan. Presenting a photographic tour of fairy houses. From rustic habitats to fairy mansions, these are the creations of families, gardeners and nature lovers...everywhere!

Lunge-Larsen, Lise; illustrated by Beth Krommes. **The Hidden Folk : Stories of Fairies, Dwarves, Selkies, and Other Secret Beings.** Ju 398.2 Lun. Brief stories featuring such creatures as flower fairies, elves, dwarves, and river sprites.

Mayer, Marianna **The Adventures of Tom Thumb.** Ju 398.2 May. A tiny boy has adventures in a cow's mouth, a fish's belly, and the stomach of a giant.

Philip, Neal. **The Little People: Stories of Fairies, Pixies and Other Small Folk.** Ju 398.2 Phi. Describes the origins, physical characteristics, dwelling places, activities, and special powers of different types of fairy folk from around the world. Illustrative traditional stories from various cultures are interspersed throughout the text.
