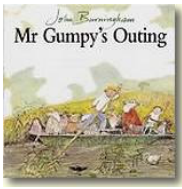


Brown, Margaret Wise; illustrated by Clement Hurd. **Goodnight Moon.**

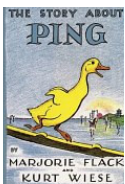

Four-year-old Tommy enjoys his relationship with both his grandmother and great-grandmother, but eventually learns to face their inevitable death.

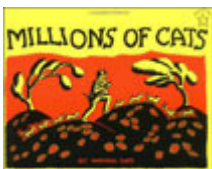

A little duck finds adventure on the Yangtze River when he is too late to board his master's houseboat one evening.

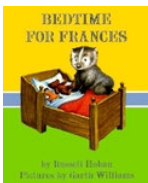

Harold goes for an adventurous walk in the moonlight with his purple crayon.

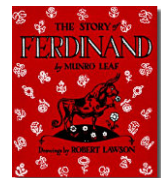

A peaceable bull is mistakenly thrown into a bullring with a proud matador and an arena filled with lovely ladies wearing flowers in their hat.

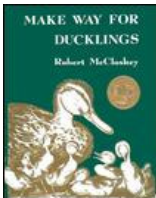

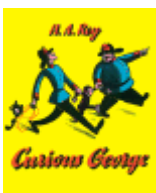

Peter disobeys his mother by going into Mr. McGregor's garden and almost gets caught.

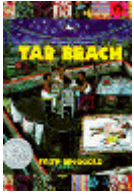

The curiosity of a newly-captured monkey gets him into continual trouble.

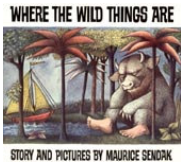

A band of mischievous monkeys steals every one of a peddler's caps while he takes a nap under a tree.

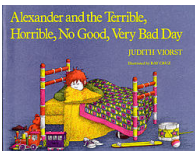
